Withdrawn – Neighborhood Market Configurations

The set of Neighborhood Market configurations published in Bulletin 1227 (March 13, 2009) have been withdrawn and will not be replaced with new specific Neighborhood Market configurations.

The many local grocer, dealer and wholesaler preferences for software and hardware choices and configurations, and the frequently required changes make it impractical to manage and communicate.

Of course, StoreNext's Neighborhood Market program with various wholesalers will continue. However, the specific configurations themselves will be determined by dealers and wholesalers according to local choices. The current array of core Express and Espresso packages provide the platform from which an almost infinite variety of configurations can be assembled according to preference.

User pricing and discounts for those configurations will also be determined by the participating dealers and wholesalers. Dealer pricing from StoreNext will be according to the then-current published prices of existing packages and products.
