### ISS45 V7 EOD Shortlist Correction

During the end-of-day processing on a dual server system, the files in the PCMASTER directory are copied from the initiating server to the backup server. Normally this is from MFS1 to MFS2. As part of this routine the batch file E-OF-DAY.BAT is copied.

At the time the E-OF-DAY.BAT file is copied the "go to" label on the second line is not correct. The results are that if, on the next day's close, the end-of-day was started from MFS2 instead of MFS1 the results of the store close would be incorrect.

To correct this situation, on all systems from V7.7.1 and up, a line has to be added near the very end of the E-OF-DAY.BAT file. This change will cause an rcopy of a correct version of E-OF-DAY.BAT to be performed from the initiating server to the backup server.

Before making this change insure that the E-OF-DAY.BAT file starts with these three lines –

```
call sys-type
goto STARTEOD
:STARTEOD
```

You must be sure to make this change on both servers.

This change can be made on a stand-alone server with no ill effects.

The additional line is shown below in bold type.
